

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL & FULL DAY PREK

Students in PreKinder through fifth grade benefit from a program that is designed to meet the needs of the young child. Eighty-two NISD elementary campuses offer programs that provide for maximum learning opportunities in reading, writing, mathematics, science, social studies, physical education, fine arts, and STEM.

STEM Labs

STEM Labs on every elementary campus allow students hands-on learning with science, technology and engineering concepts with dedicated time to explore and create. Northside STEM Labs introduce students to coding and robotics, providing students the chance to develop a growth mindset and allowing for navigation of future school and career choices. We emphasize perseverance and allow students the space and time to make corrections and improve upon their work

Gifted and Talented Program

At Northside Independent School District, we believe that every student's potential deserves to be recognized and nurtured. Our Elementary Gifted and Talented (GT) program is designed to empower young minds with significantly advanced intellectual abilities. Each of our elementary campuses boasts a full-time GT Specialist who orchestrates a rich array of services, including pullout sessions that foster creative and independent thinking for students. Our program is rooted in a specially-designed curriculum that aligns with the Texas State Plan for Gifted/Talented Education. Our commitment is to provide an environment where gifted students can thrive intellectually and socially, building the foundation for a lifelong love of learning.

Fine Arts

Fine Arts instruction is part of the Northside elementary curriculum, to provide our students the opportunity to create and to imagine what can be. Our certified art and music specialists teach a TEKS-driven curriculum at 100 percent of the district elementary campuses. Students experience multiple hands-on opportunities to develop a joy for singing, dancing, playing musical instruments, and creating art pieces in 2-D and 3-D forms. Elementary art and music programs are highly visible and involve all students. Skills developed in fine arts classes serve to develop the whole child for future success in any career path.

Physical Education

Physical Education is an integral part of the overall education of all students in the Northside Independent School District. The primary goal of physical education is to motivate students to pursue and continue active lifestyles by developing motor skills necessary to perform a variety of physical activities. It is also essential that students develop knowledge, understanding and positive attitudes about human movement. Northside offers quality physical education programs that provide learning opportunities that are meaningful, motivational, and challenging to the students.

Bilingual, Dual Language, and ESL

In Northside, we embrace diversity and provide a high-quality learning experience for all. We build upon the linguistic, academic, and cognitive experiences of students and families to develop students' mastery of the English language. Our goal is to achieve academic excellence, and honor multiculturalism through meaningful learning experiences that inspire students' confidence, curiosity, and capability. We do this through our Bilingual Transition Program, Dual Language Immersion Program and English as a Second Language Program. The Bilingual, Dual Language, and ESL programs are available at designated campuses.

Northside School District's After-School Program offers opportunities for children to access academic enrichment, social, and recreational experiences in an environment that is safe and supervised. It is run by Northside's Community Education Department. 

MIDDLE SCHOOLS

Northside students in grades six through eight benefit from a program designed to meet the needs of the adolescent child. Our 21 middle school campuses offer strong academic programs within the core subjects of mathematics, social studies, science, and English Language Arts and include three Middle School Magnet Programs. Students also take courses in physical education and electives such as computer literacy, fine arts, family and consumer science, foreign language, career and technology education, and Skills for Adolescence. Enrichment and acceleration can be achieved through Pre-AP classes and gifted programs. Advanced Learning Programs for High Achievers (ALPHA) offers an array of services for gifted and talented students in middle school. Northside ISD middle schools focus on ensuring students are college and career ready through:

Fine Arts

Fine Arts instruction is part of the Northside middle school curriculum to provide our students the opportunity to create and to imagine what can be. The Fine Arts Department is committed to providing our students and teachers cutting-edge environments in which to differentiate instruction and to participate in venues that serve to enhance learning. Public performance and gallery initiatives allow our students to grow personally and serve to connect outstanding campus fine art programs to a great city, state, and nation. World-renown artists, conductors, clinicians, and consultants constantly make meaningful connections to our students in the classroom. Northside performing ensembles and student artwork continue to be recognized at the state and national level. Regardless of the student's interest level to be at an appreciation level, an understanding level, or a mastery level of learning, we teach our students to use the skills that are unique to fine arts to facilitate and to elevate their role as quality citizens, great leaders, incredible problem-solvers, professional artists, and yes... as lifelong consumers of the arts. Our middle schools offer classes exposing students to visual arts, band, choir, dance, mariachi, orchestra and theater.

Athletics

Through our passion for athletics, we will instill a purposeful life in our student-athletes. Through their passion for athletics, our student-athletes will learn the value of adversity through perseverance, creating character traits that will instill a purposeful life. At our middle school campuses, we offer our students the opportunity to play football, volleyball, basketball, soccer, track, tennis, and golf.

Spanish

In Northside ISD, Spanish language courses are designed to achieve the following objectives as aligned with the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Languages Other Than English (TEKS for LOTE): To satisfy the needs of students who wish to pursue specific work to increase their ability to listen, speak, read, and write the Spanish language.

- To provide students the opportunity to compare and contrast their language and culture with those of Spanish-speaking countries and other parts of the world.
- To provide students with the opportunity to relate the topics to other subject areas, making Spanish relevant to the students' overall academic experience.
- To encourage students to seek opportunities to practice Spanish outside of the classroom by interacting with family members and members of the community.
- To encourage students to understand that they are members of a global society and help them develop "survival" skills in the language in order to function effectively in social interactions and discussions.
- To provide students with the opportunity to utilize technology incorporating the usage of multi-media labs.

Gifted and Talented

Discover the exceptional Gifted and Talented (GT) program in Northside, tailored especially for middle school students. Our GT middle school curriculum is designed to nurture critical thinking, creativity, and leadership skills. Students learn foundational skills including 21st Century Skills, Next Generation Learning, Depth & Complexity, and Social/Emotional Learning, throughout the year with a curriculum that emphasizes project-based, hands-on learning across STEAM, Research, Entrepreneurship, and Character Development/Leadership strands. Guided by our dedicated campus GT Specialists, who also oversee the GT referral and testing process, your child will thrive academically and creatively.

Identified GT students attending any of our Middle School Magnets will receive GT services through specialized magnet courses and curriculum. These courses and curriculum are designed to foster

inquiry and challenge students to think critically, and create and conduct research to support their ideas and outcomes. Explore the endless possibilities for your child's educational journey with us, where they can earn high school credits while in middle school and embark on an enriching GT experience.

Career and Technical Education courses

Students in Northside's Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs spend much of their time learning through a hands-on approach that prepares students for occupations and further study. CTE programs are available in middle school and high school and are available in many career areas of interest to students. Students interested in a particular field can look at the coherent sequence of courses to see the courses that will help them prepare for their chosen careers. Students may also wish to choose an academy or magnet school designed to prepare students for careers. Northside's middle school magnet schools include Hobby Health Science Magnet, Jones STEM Magnet, and Zachry Global Communication, Information Technology & Cybersecurity Magnet.

Special Education Services

Northside ISD provides specially designed instruction and related services to students with an identified disability requiring an individualized instructional program. Our goal is to provide tools and skills necessary to strengthen each student's role in decision-making while increasing student independence and ensuring academic progress.

Advanced Academics

The Office of Advanced Academics provides unique programs that nurture the abilities of high performing students while fostering parent and community involvement by building a challenging learning environment that encourages life-long learning, nurtures high self-esteem, expands access to higher education, and provides experiences that enable students to reach their fullest potential as independent thinkers. We provide instructional opportunities and services for students with significantly advanced general intellectual ability and/or specific subject matter aptitude in language arts, science, social studies and/or mathematics. These programs provide an appropriately differentiated curriculum in an effort to help students work to their fullest potential.

SPECIALIZED MAGNET PROGRAMS

Hobby Magnet

The three-year curriculum at Hobby Magnet School includes unique English Language Arts and Science courses along with specialty Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses that expose students to the Health Science fields of therapeutic services, diagnostic services, health informatics, support services, and biotechnology research and development. Magnet students will be enrolled in multiple advanced courses and will have enhanced opportunities to earn high school credit while still in middle school.

Jones Magnet

Jones Magnet School creates authentic learning experiences whereby students come to think like engineers and scientists. Every student will be exposed to the world of STEM careers. Every student will have opportunities to explore their passions and curiosities. Every student will have highly prepared and motivated teachers. Every student will have access to world-class facilities and resources.

Zachry Magnet

Zachry Magnet School is focused on the growing industries of Cybersecurity, Global Communications, and Information Technology including CyberPatriot competitions and Junior Model UN simulations. Our program aligns for further study at NISD high schools in cybersecurity, web development, and information technology. Our innovative learning spaces include a model Intermediate Distribution Framework room, collaborative areas, and our unique "learning-stairs."
